SUBJECT Report on MACLAC Teacher Placement Directory for the Past
Three Years.

In response to your letter of October 12, 1964, I am glad to summarize for you the activities of the Teacher Placement Directory for the past three years. The activities of this office can perhaps best be summarized by giving the number of inquiries from applicants and the number of positions described to me in the various categories in each of the three years as listed below.
