Dear Dr. Lewis:

The Committee planning the Conference of College Chemistry Teachers was pleased to hear of your willingness to be a participant. Your name is being listed in the invitations which will go forward to the colleges shortly. Other speakers will be Professor A.S. Garrett of Ohio State University and Dr. S.M. Volwiler of the Abbott Laboratories. Professor H. L. Harnisch of Wabash College will be the Director.

As you have suggested in your letter of August 5th, I will plan to see you in Atlantic City relative to the general nature of your after-dinner talk. Is it possible that you could have breakfast with me on September 16th at 7:30 A.M. I am inviting also Professors Garrett and Harnisch. It is my thought that a meeting of the principal program participants will help measurably to expedite arrangement of details with respect to the program. I will be staying at the Hotel Madison which is located just off the Boardwalk on Illinois Avenue. (Key No. 25 on map in the Chem. and Engr. NEWS, August 18, 1952, p. 3394). We could meet there near the information desk at the appointed hour. If this time should not be convenient perhaps we could arrange another. I will be in Atlantic City September 14-19. (Our breakfast, as well as all other meetings of the Convention, are listed under Eastern Daylight Saving Time.)

Dr. Volwiler's address Saturday evening will be entitled "The Scientist's Place in the Future." Inasmuch as he will not be immediately concerned with the preceding meetings, having declined for good reasons our invitation to meet with the college group during Saturday afternoon, it seems unnecessary to include him in the breakfast meeting at Atlantic City. Dr. Volwiler will address an audience composed of members of the Illinois-Iowa Section, invited guests from the community, and members of the Conference.

We are grateful to you for informing us of dedications being planned at Grinnell and Hamline. Professor Beveridge, Dean of the College, has contacted each of the colleges and has learned that Grinnell has not yet set a date, Hamline's date is October 17th.
