Where: McMichael Science Hall, Monmouth College, Monmouth, Illinois.

Who: The Conference is for teachers of college chemistry in independent liberal arts colleges of the Midwest Conference area (Illinois, Iowa, Minnesota, and Wisconsin) and the neighboring states of Indiana and Missouri.
