I see no reason at all why you cannot do whatever you wish about including experiments which were first described in \underline{J} . Chem. Ed. For this you certainly have my permission as far as copyright is concerned. You must, however, give full bibliographic reference, which I am sure you will do, and also indicate (preferably in the preface) that this was done with the consent of the Editor.

I would add one important feature: this is, that I do not think of articles in J. Chem. Ed. as being "experiments" as they would appear in a laboratory manual. An article in J. Chem. Ed. should be written for the teacher. It should give him the main idea, provide him with the essential description of the apparatus, but should not be a set of instructions which could be handed to a student in order to do the experiment. I feel that our articles should provide the teacher with sufficient leeway for adaption to his own circumstances and intentions. I think you should present your case to the authors that these articles would be rewritten, either by your Editorial Board or perhaps by the author to match your format. Excellent examples of what I mean appeared in the February issue.

Best of luck on your project. Thanks very much for keeping me informed. Very best regards.
