

#### TRAVEL AND HOUSING

#### Air Travel

Both Indianapolis and Dayton have frequent air service from Chicago, Minneapolis and St. Louis. The Dayton airport is about 45 minutes from Earlham and the Indianapolis airport is about 1 1/2 hours. The simplest procedure would be for you to make your own arrangements to rent a car at the airport and then car pool with chemists from your own or neighboring institutions. 30% discounts are available from Hertz & Avis or via AAA. Should this prove difficult we can arrange airport pickups at our cost, if you let us know by October 1.

#### Road Travel

Richmond is on I-70 which also passes close to both Indianapolis and Dayton airports. Get off I-70 at Exit 149a (Richmond, 5th St.) and go south into Richmond. There are also Richmond exits both east and west of the 5th St. exit, but it is easiest to take N.W. 5th St. south until it joins National Road West (US 40) and then go two blocks west to the campus. #### Housing
