MIDWESTERN CONFERENCE OF LIBERAL ARTS COLLEGE CHEMISTRY TEACHEERS

3:00 Business Meeting. The following items are on the agenda:

1. Membership

Except for a few teachers colleges in Illinois, the group which voted to organize the "Midwest Association" consisted of chemistry teachers in non-tax-supported liberal arts colleges. Invitations to the Appleton meeting have been issued only to the latter such institutions in the seven states of Minnesota, Iowa, Missouri, Illinois, Wisconsin, Indiana and Michigan. The question of extending the membership beyond this limitation must be discussed.

2. Financial Structure

What dues shall be assessed? Does the association wish to enter into an agreement with the JOURNAL OF CHEMICAL EDUCATION whereby an annual subscription to the journal is included in the dues at a special rate of \$2.50 per year (regular rate \$3.50)? The association would thereby be allotted a page or two each month for news of its activities and publication of its summaries.

3. Survey of Industry for Support of Research

Those present at Monmouth requested that the American Chemical Society be invited to collect information from the chemistry industry with a listing of those companies that would provide financing for research projects in the chemistry departments of liberal arts colleges. Executive Secretary Alden H. Emery of the A.C.S. has tossed the matter back into the association's lap. Shall we proceed with this project?
