Dear Dr. Schwan:

Thank you for your letter of 1 October, with the renewed request that the 1959 Maclac meeting be held at your university. This item is on the agenda for the coming meeting, and will be discussed by the executive council.

We also have a request, of long standing, from three of the colleges in the St. Paul, Minnesota area. It is not unlikely that the council will see special merit in this request because of the geographic location. It has been the policy to alternate between a "central" and a "fringe" location from year to year. Since this year the meeting is centrally located, and since Minnesota has never had a meeting, there will be strong reason for considering the St. Paul request.
