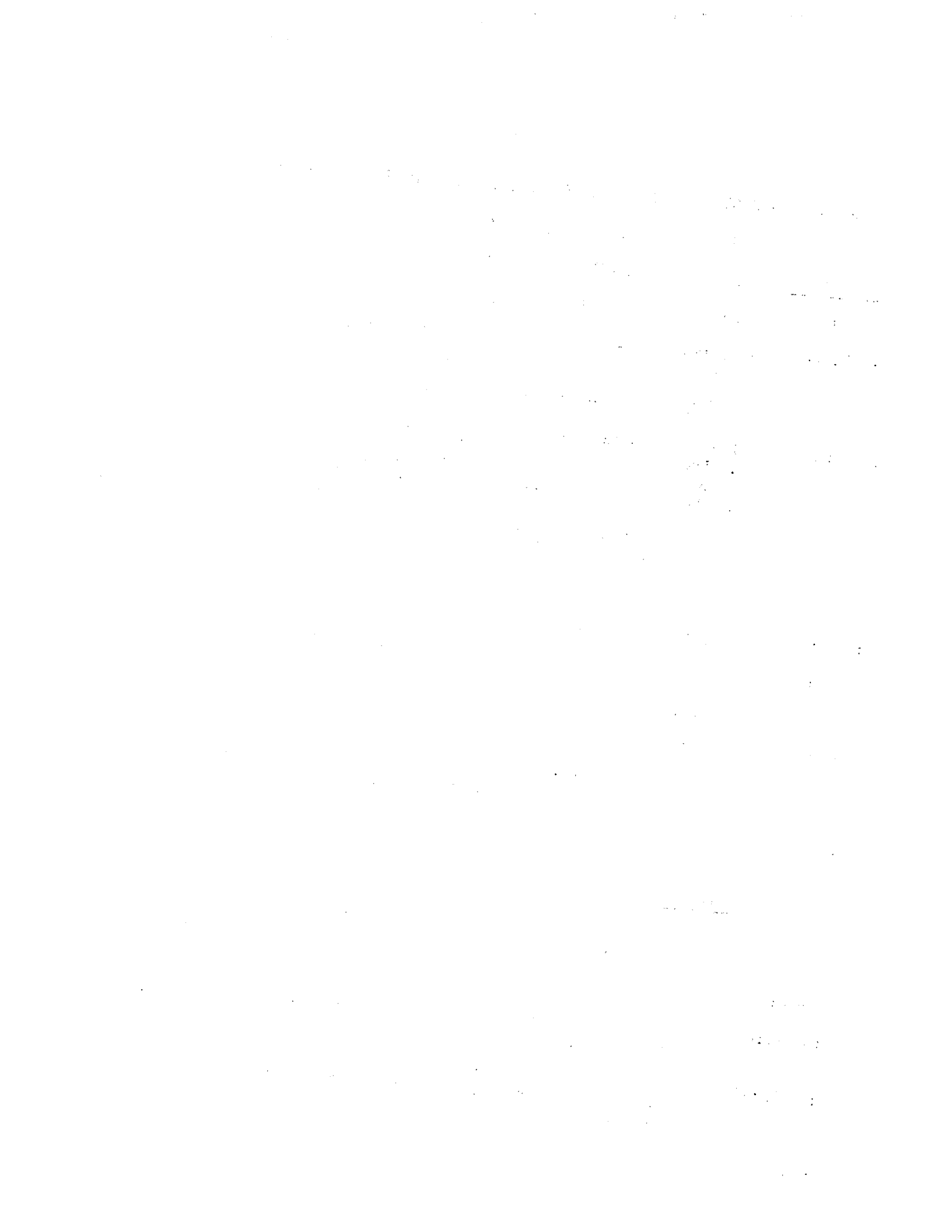

I. TRAVEL

Arrivals by Car

Leave U. S. 41 at Deerpath exit (a grade separation) and proceed east to second stop-light. Turn right onto Sheridan Road (Route 42). Proceed south one block on Sheridan Road to first cross-street (College Road), turn left into Middle Campus. Proceed straight ahead and park in any available space near Johnson Memorial Science Center (recognizable by circular Science library in front).

Arrivals by Train

A timetable for C+NW commuter service between Chicago and Lake Forest is enclosed. Taxi service is available for the short trip between the Lake Forest station and the college.

Arrivals by Air

1. O'Hare Airport: Vehicles marked "LAKE FOREST COLLEGE" will depart from the upper ramp in front of the airport for the college at 10:00 AM and 12:00 noon on Friday. Airport officials have given assurances that they will try to provide a central parking area for these vehicles on the upper ramp. Only those indicating a desire for this service can be accommodated. Alternately, you may take an airport bus to Evanston and then a C+NW train to Lake Forest.

Return transportation to O'Hare, leaving the college at 1:30 PM on Saturday, will be provided for those who so indicate on the enclosed sheet. The trip between the college and O'Hare requires about 45 minutes.

In accordance with a decision of the Executive Committee made at Wabash last year, a charge will be made for these transportation services, payable at the time they are provided. The charge will depend on the number of vehicles needed and the number of passengers, but will probably not exceed \$2.50 per passenger one way.

2. Midway Airport: No transportation service will be provided by the college. You may take a bus to downtown Chicago and then a C+NW train to Lake Forest.

A shuttle service will be provided at convenient times between the college and the Pagoda Motel and other motels on Friday and Saturday. No charge will be made for this service.

II. HOUSING

Every attempt will be made to accommodate all registrants in a limited number of motels in close proximity to each other to facilitate shuttle service to and from the campus. Room reservations must be received by Lake Forest College on or before October 16, if accommodations are to be guaranteed. Do not make reservations directly with the motel.

There is a limited supply of single rooms which will be allotted on a first come, first served basis. If you desire a double room (two double beds), and have a preference for a roommate, please indicate your choice of same. A few cots can be made available to accommodate three to a room, or two can double up in a double bed if there is a strong desire to "triple up" in a room.

On your arrival you may obtain your motel assignment either at the registration desk at the college or at the Pagoda Motor Inn located at the intersection of Rt. 41 and Buckley Road, Route 137 (approximately 4-1/2 miles north of Lake Forest on Rt. 41).

III. MEALS

The Pagoda Motor Inn operates a small snack bar, and the Adrea Restaurant adjoins the Motor Inn. There are several other restaurants and snack bars between the Motor Inn and the college.

Meal Schedule:

Friday lunch - registrants are advised to find their own eating places as the College Commons is ordinarily crowded at this hour.

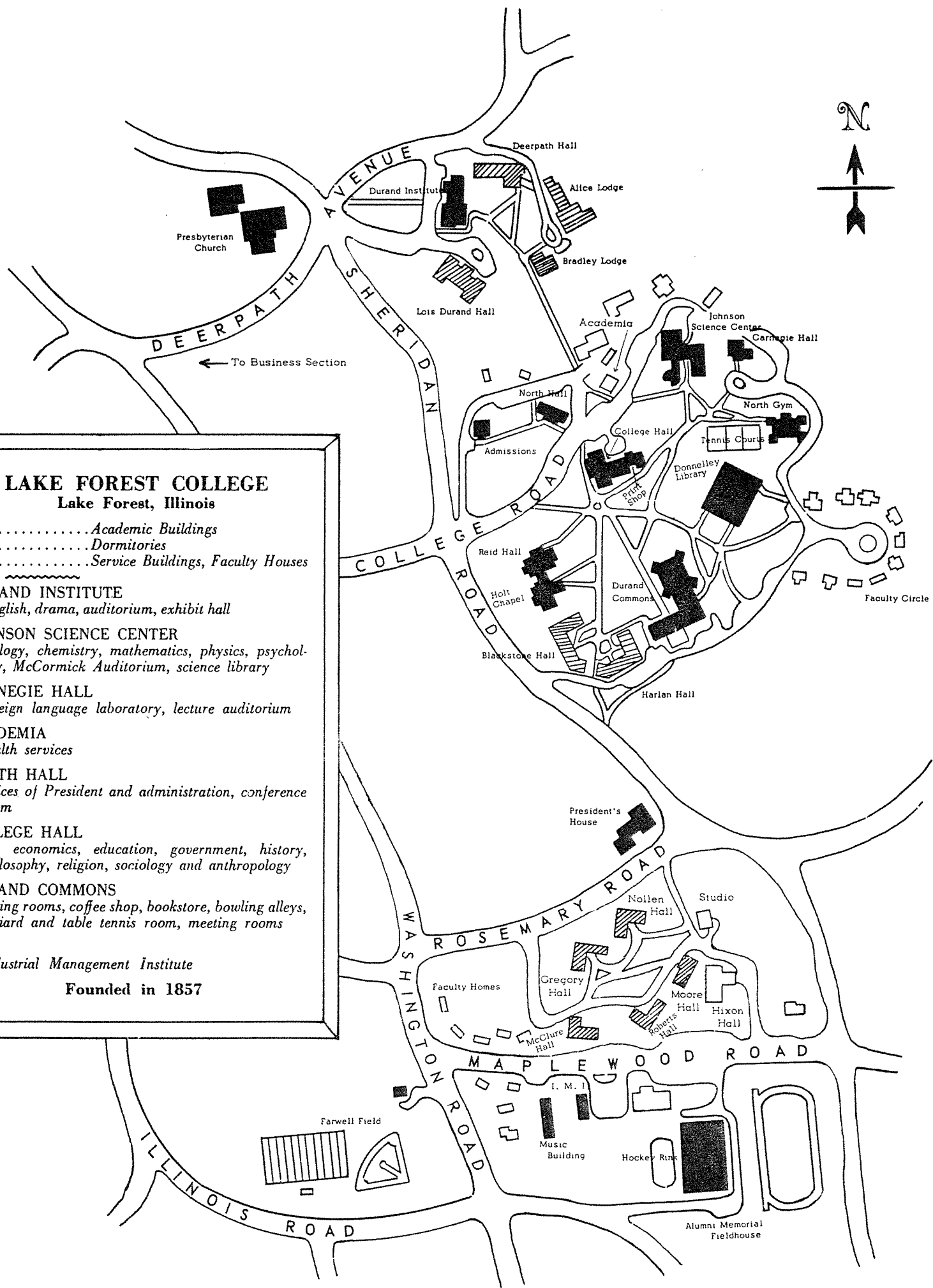
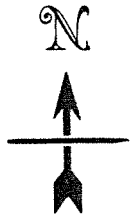
Friday dinner - 7:00 P.M., College Commons. \$2.25
