Enclosed is a copy of my recent letter to our president, Joe Danforth, and a facsimile of the contract which I propose to sign with D. Van Nostrand for eventual publication of the experimental portion of our P. Chem. Manual. You will notice that the sentence relating to a definite date for delivery of the manuscript has been cancelled. They realize that we will necessarily have to move slowly in this. The advantage of signing a contract now is that we can settle many matters of style, format, etc., early enough so that this will not have to be done over later. Also the help and advice of their science editor, Mr. Soros, and their consultants will be of an advantage to us.

In case replies are favorable, and I am authorized to sign for MACTLAC, I will immediately make out an agreement assigning royalties from the experiment section (only) to the MACTLAC organization.
