CONFERENCE OF COLLEGE CHEMISTRY TEACHERS

Sponsored by Monmouth College  
As a Centennial Year Event

When: Friday and Saturday, November 14 and 15, 1958.

Where: Michael Science Hall, Monmouth College, Monmouth, Illinois.  
Monmouth is located 20 miles southwest of Chicago on the main  
line of the Burlington railroad at the intersection of U.S.  
Highways No. 34 and No. 57.

Who:

The Conference is for teachers of college chemistry in independent  
liberal arts colleges of the Midwest Conference area (Illinois,  
Iowa, Minnesota, and Wisconsin, and the neighboring states of  
Indiana and Missouri).

What:

"An Evaluation of the Teaching of College Chemistry in Liberal Arts  
Colleges" has been planned as a part of Monmouth's Centennial Program.  
It seems especially fitting that those who are so intimately associated  
with this work should meet together to discuss common problems, such as  
objectives, curricula, teaching methods, placement, research activities,  
and other relevant matters. The atmosphere will be informal; it will  
be punctuated by expression of points of view of chemists of national  
and international reputation—A. B. Guzzett, Professor of Chemistry,  
The Ohio State University, Hany Lewis, Dean of the Institute of Paper  
Chemistry, A. H. Volwiler, President and General Manager, Abbott  
Laboratory, W. L. Hammett, Professor of Chemistry, Chairman of the  
Department, Agribus College, will be the Director. W. S. Hammett,  
Professor Emeritus of Chemistry, Monmouth College, is serving as General  
Chairman.

The final announcement with respect to the program will be called  
about the middle of October. At that time an invitation will be ex-  
tended to submit the names of those who will be in attendance at the  
Conference.
