
Dear Doctor Bayer:


Dear Dr. Ramette:

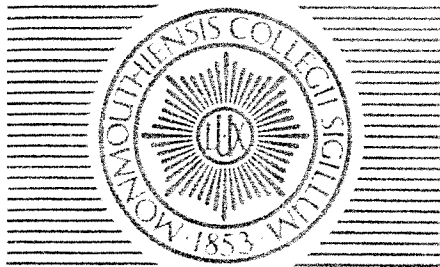

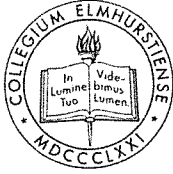


