I have enclosed a copy of your letter of October 5, 1970 in which you reaffirmed Monmouth College's interest in hosting the 1972 annual meeting of the Midwest Association of Chemistry Teachers in Liberal Arts Colleges (MACTLAC). At its 1970 (October) meeting the MACTLAC Executive Council unanimously voted to hold the 1972 meeting at Monmouth College. There was considerable sentiment for returning, after 20 years, to the site of MACTLAC's founding. This acceptance of your invitation was passed on to Quentin Petersen.

At the 1971 (October) MACTLAC Executive Council meeting, Quentin shared his hesitancy, as department chairman of a three man department, to host the 1972 MACTLAC meeting. The local host department for a MACTLAC meeting bears the major responsibility for a two day program, in addition to the normal meeting responsibilities of making arrangements for rooms, meals, lodging and registration. We felt the Monmouth chemistry staff reduction made it impossible for the Monmouth chemistry department to continue a full teaching load and to host a MACTLAC meeting of distinction. For that reason, the MACTLAC Executive Council unanimously voted to move the 1972 meeting from Monmouth College to Knox College. This decision was reached after considerable discussion of ways to hold the meeting at Monmouth. Our negative action is not akin to MACTLAC, but we felt the staff time and the departmental stability requisite to support a MACTLAC meeting are no longer present in the Monmouth Chemistry Department.
