Dear Bill:

I am sorry that I will not be able to come to Alma College for the MACTLAC meeting this year. Unfortunately, I have to make a trip to Minnesota that week, and I regret that I will not be seeing you and the rest of our colleagues at that time. I thought you and perhaps MACTLAC in general might be interested in a resume of my activities as employment clearing house director. If you wish, you can use the accompanying table as a sort of interim report to MACTLAC. Perhaps the most striking feature is the imbalance, with the organic applicants greatly outnumbering the openings, whereas in physical the reverse was true to a lesser extent. If you feel that you would like more information, I would be glad to give you any more details you like.

I had a nice visit with Phil Marshall in Atlantic City and apparently you are well under way at Cornell for another college year. I hope that I will be getting down to see you sometime, but in the meantime I wish you the best of luck.
