

SUBJECT: Report of the Sixteenth Annual Meeting, held at Carroll

College, Waukesha, Wisconsin on October 11-12, 1968.

Carroll College had the privilege of being the host of the Sixteenth Annual Meeting of MACTLAC. We enjoyed having a record attendance of 253 members and wish to thank all that contributed to the success of the meeting.

The Friday afternoon program began with an interesting lecture given by Dr. Robert Walter in which he gave the results of an AC<sub>3</sub> committee report on chemistry in the liberal arts colleges. The banquet on Friday evening was followed by a presentation by "Mr. Demonstration" -- Dr. Hubert Alyea. The colored lights, explosions and interesting stories revealed the methods Dr. Alyea has used to make his students excited about chemistry. Dr. Irving Shain gave an excellent lecture on Saturday in which complex topics in electrochemistry were presented in terms understandable to all.
