He would appreciate a clarification of his status and the advice of the group as to how the time spent for the group could be most usefully employed.

6. We need further discussion of broad trends in physical chemistry teaching as a guide to the development of new experiments. Almost equally important are decisions on which of the "classical" laboratory experiments should be dropped or not included in our manual.

7. Additional topics for discussion suggested from the floor.
